The CMP is a non-profit corporation chartered by the U.S. Congress to promote firearms safety training and marksmanship, especially for youth. CMP sales of U.S. Government surplus rifles, ammo and related merchandise help fund CMP Junior programs, affiliated shooting club programs and the CMP hosted National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches at Camp Perry.

Some background information first. Camp Perry is located at Port Clinton approximately 25-30 miles from our 2010 ASA-Turkey reunion at the Hilton in Toledo. Camp Perry is currently a Pennsylvania National Guard base where the NRA sponsored National Matches are held July through August each year. These matches are for both rifle and pistol and are open for both civilian and military shooters. CMP East is located on the grounds of Camp Perry and sells used military rifles given to them by the U.S.

government for the promotion of rifle marksmanship and to support many shooting programs in the U.S.

Elder asked if I would be willing to take a contingent to the CMP warehouse for anyone interested in buying a rifle or carbine. These firearms are all well used and some will have more than others. You will be able to pick your own manufacturer and condition and take it with you.

I will be than glad to help you pick one out. However you will need to have the following information with you for a purchase.

1. Proof of U.S. citizenship; copy of birth certificate, passport, or a official government document showing birth. (I suggest the first two only)
2. Current or past military service I.D. card
3. Concealed Weapons Permit
4. C & R License
5. Member of CMP affiliated gun club

You will only need one of the 5 above plus proof of citizenship for a purchase. The Garands will run \$495.00- 695.00 depending on make and condition and the Carbines will run \$419.00-495.00. Remember these firearms sell for over \$1000.00 on Gunbroker or gunshows. Parts like new stocks and accessories will also be available at the CMP store. If you decide to purchase a collector rifle, remember they will be dirty and greasy so bring something suitable to wrap up your purchase. I don't know if the CMP will provide one. I would like to hear from those interested, and will be glad to answer any questions. Sorry Elder, I checked and they don't have any 30-40 Krag's like you carried up San Juan Hill back in '98! 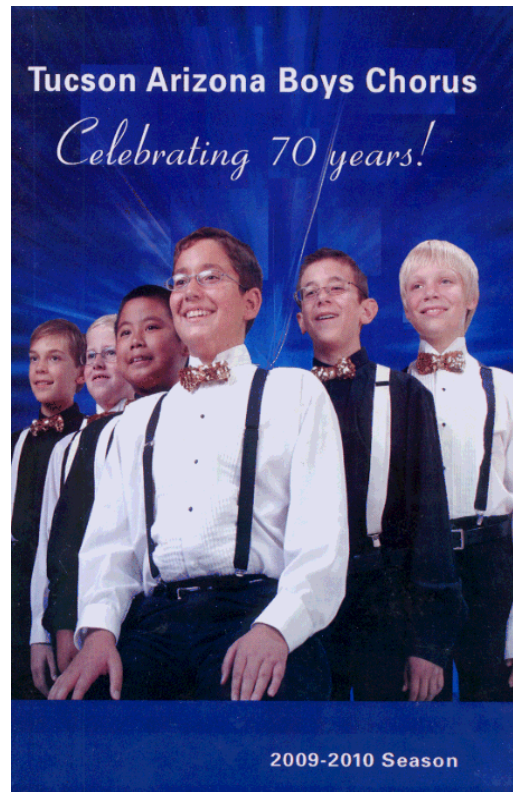
